Bring any letters about your

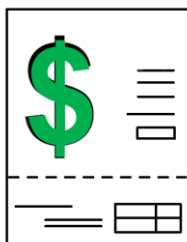
- wages



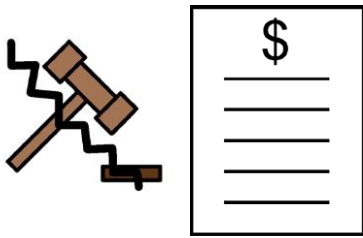
- money from Centrelink



- debts

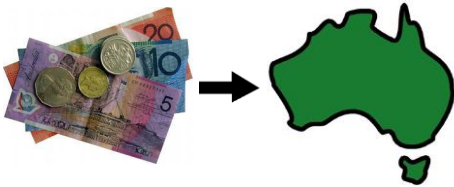


- bills



- fines.

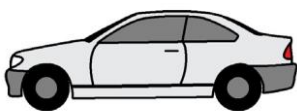
Also bring any letters about your
