Uniting WA and Foodbank WA join forces to establish two new mobile locations.

With the rising cost of living, we know that money has been tight this year for many individuals and families, which has led to food insecurity. That's why Uniting WA is proud to have supported the expansion of two new Mobile Foodbank locations in Perth's northern suburbs.

In August 2021, Uniting WA Financial Counsellor Paul Jordan helped to establish a new Mobile Foodbank location in Yanchep. Foodbank WA now visits Yanchep Men's Shed (2 Bracknell Street, Yanchep) every Tuesday from 9:30am to 10:30am.

In April 2022, Uniting WA also supported Foodbank WA to establish a new Mobile Foodbank location in Two Rocks. Supported by Uniting WA volunteers and financial counsellors, the van operates every Tuesday from 11:30am to 12:15pm in the Phil Renkin Recreation Centre car park (59 Lisford Avenue, Two Rocks).
