#### **Update on Residential Tenancies Act 1987**

Reforms to the Residential Tenancies Act 1987 were passed by the Western Australian State Parliament on the 16th of April 2024. These changes will come into effect between May 2024 and early 2025.

These changes include:

- · Rent bidding ban
- Rent increases will only be allowed once ever 12 months unless your rent is calculated by income
- · Pets are welcome if permission is granted
- You can make minor home modifications if permission is granted

These changes aim to give tenants the freedom to make their house feel like a home, and to provide a fair balance between the rights of tenants and landlords.

#### Low Cost, Easy, Delicious Recipes



Chicken and Broccoli
Pasta

- 350g broccoli, cut into small florets, stems cut into matchsticks
- 300g dried curly fettuccine pasta
- 1/2 barbecued chicken, skin and bones removed, meat coarsely shredded
- 2 x 80g Boursin Garlic & Herbs cheese
- 125g (3/4 cup) sun-dried tomatoes, coarsely chopped
- Bring a large saucepan of water to the boil. Add the broccoli and cook for 2
  minutes or until bright green and tender crisp. Use a slotted spoon to
  transfer the broccoli to a bowl. Add the pasta to the boiling water and cook
  following packet directions or until al dente.
- While the pasta cooks, heat a frying pan over medium-high heat.
   Add chicken, broccoli, cheese and tomato. Use a ladle to transfer 250ml (1 cup) pasta cooking water to the chicken mixture. Stir until the cheese melts. Continue to cook, tossing, for 2-3 minutes or until heated through.
- Drain the pasta and add to the broccoli mixture. Toss until well combined. Season.
